

the eighth "PUNCHBOWL MARATHON" 6th June, 1976

Report and List Of Finishers

In the continuing period of dry warm weather over seventy people set out from Witley on the new route. This was the lowest number to date and really reflects the amount of publicity done. Although the walkers affiliations are not recorded in the following list the vast majority were LDWA members. Previously the walk had been organised by the Guildford and Godalming Athletic Club but from this year the Surrey LDWA Group are the promoters.

Those who had completed the marathon before will agree that the new route was a further improvement with its variety of terrain, although it was possibly rather longer than the nominal thirty miles. Also the distances quoted for the latter stages seemed a little long which caused several people to hurry to get home in time. Others were not so lucky however because a newly erected fence after Branley caused a number of walkers to deviate from the route and become lost for awhile. The percentage of "over-time" finishers must have been a record at 36%.

The first two finishers ran the course which accounts for their short time. Valerie Peel, the third walker back, put the ladies up a rung in finishing so high up the list. The furthest traveller to the event was probably Mike Benison from Taunton and the youngest to complete the marathon was Ian Blatchford aged nine.

Praise must go to Jeff Ellingham who took over as chief organiser and in fact just about ran the event himself.
