They also learnt how hard it is to set unambiguous clues! They accepted 4 blades to a windmill sail (tho' 8 was the answer) and 2 for the SV sign on the 12 miler. A second Roman numeral was found at Shere church also. They did not penalise genuine mistakes as with '3' for the no. of sides on a signpost and only gave 0 points. Outright guessing was penalised, though. All clues were found by someone, so the organisers must have been right!

Accurate navigation gave a good score for Barbara (and good local knowledge!), but the reverse was true for Martyn!
